

Hare

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Materials:

When using the suggested materials, it will be about 18 cm tall.

- fluffy wool, bulky (7 wpi) - for me: Schoeller + Stahl Elfin (Fb. 01)
- some contrasting color (black or brown), optional some pink for the nose
- *optional*: wool of choice (worsted weight) for the hat
- *optional*: wool for carrots and easter eggs (sport weight)
- *optional*: parcel twine (for the basket)
- *optional*: pink crayon
- Crochet hooks in suitable sizes (for me: 2.5 mm, 4 mm, 6 mm)
- Stuffing
- Eyes in suitable size (for me: 15 mm)

Abbreviations (US Terms):

MR = magic ring
sc = single crochet
ch = chain
st = stitch
slst = slip stitch
inc = increase
dec = decrease
BLO = back loop only
FLO = front loop only
rev sc = reverse single crochet

The specifications of the wool and needle sizes are only examples/references. If You use other wool than specified, the figure will become taller or smaller. It's Your choice which wool you use. The needle size must be chosen to match the wool used. When crocheting Amigurumis You should use a much smaller needle size than indicated on the banderole or You would use it for other crochet projects so that no

holes are made when the piece is stuffed. With a needle size of 2 mm, my gauge sample results in a diameter of 4.5 cm for six crocheted rounds.

You are working in continuous rounds, unless otherwise specified in the pattern.

I hope, it's understandable and I'm really sorry if something sounds weird. 😊

Head:

1. sc 6 in MR (6)
2. inc x6 (12)
3. (sc 1, inc) x6 (18)
4. (sc 2, inc) x6 (24)
5. (sc 3, inc) x6 (30)
6. (sc 4, inc) x6 (36)
7. (sc 5, inc) x6 (42)
8. (sc 6, inc) x6 (48)
- 9.-14. (6 Rounds) sc in each st (48)
15. sc 18, inc x3, sc 6, inc x3, sc 18 (54)
16. sc 18, (sc 1, inc) x3, sc 6, (sc 1, inc) x3, sc 18 (60)
- 17.-20. (4 Rounds) sc in each st (60)
21. sc 18, (dec, sc 1) x3, sc 6, (sc 1, dec) x3, sc 18 (54)
22. sc 18, dec x3, sc 6, dec x3, sc 18 (48)
23. (sc 6, dec) x6 (42)
24. (sc 5, dec) x6 (36)
25. (sc 4, dec) x6 (30)
26. (sc 3, dec) x6 (24)
27. (sc 2, dec) x6 (18)

Stuff and shape the head.

28. (sc 1, dec) x6 (12)
29. dec x6 (6)

Fasten off invisibly.

Shape the face:

First mark the spots for nose and mouth as shown in the picture below.



You can shape with the contrasting color directly or use a head colored yarn for shaping first. With a long needle pierce from the bottom into the head and come out at the middle, upper pin (see picture). Run the yarn outside along the head, go with the needle into the pin directly below your current point and go back to the very first point at the bottom. Tighten yarn and knot well. With the same yarn do the last

forming stitches for mouth and nose (see picture below), after each stitch go back to the bottom and knot well.



Last you have to do the eye sockets, I've used a new thread for it. Mark the spots for the eyes with pins. Come from the bottom to Your first eye marker, skip 1 stitch, go in there and come out at the other eye marker, skip 1 stitch again and go back to the bottom. Tighten the yarn to shape the eye sockets and knot it well. Repeat the steps, if needed and hide the ends in the head.



New new the eyes to the head. Now paint the nose with crayon or something like that or embroider with pink thread.

Body:


(bottom up)

1. sc 6 in MR (6)
2. inc x6 (12)
3. (sc 1, inc) x6 (18)
4. (sc 2, inc) x6 (24)
5. (sc 3, inc) x6 (30)
6. (sc 4, inc) x6 (36)
7. (sc 5, inc) x6 (42)
8. (sc 6, inc) x6 (48)
9. sc 16, (inc, sc 2)x5, inc, sc 16 (54)
- 10.-18. (9 Rounds) fM in jede M (54)
19. sc 16, (dec, sc 2) x5, dec, sc 16 (48)
- 20.-21. (2 Rounds) sc in each st (48)
22. (sc 6, dec) x6 (42)

- 23.-24. (2 Rounds) sc in each st (42)
- 25. (sc 5, dec) x6 (36)
- 26.-27. (2 Rounds) sc in each st (36)
- 28. (sc 4, dec) x6 (30)
- 29.-30. (2 Rounds) sc in each st (30)
- 31. (sc 3, dec) x6 (24)
- 32.-33. (2 Rounds) sc in each st (24)

Fasten off, leave a long tail for sewing. Stuff and shape the body.

Put the head to the body and fix it with pins. Sew the head to the body. Add more stuffing if necessary before you finally close it down.



Hind leg - upper part (make 2):

- 1. sc 6 in MR (6)
- 2. inc x6 (12)
- 3. (sc 1, inc) x6 (18)
- 4. (sc 2, inc) x6 (24)
- 5. (sc 3, inc) x6 (30)
- 6. (sc 4, inc) x6 (36)
- 7. (sc 5, inc) x6 (42)
- 8.-14. (7 Rounds) sc in each st (42)
- 15. (sc 5, dec) x6 (36)
- 16. (sc 4, dec) x6 (30)
- 17. (sc 3, dec) x6 (24)
- 18. (sc 2, dec) x6 (18)


Stuff the leg very loosely (see picture).

Fasten off, leave a long tail for sewing, flatten and sew the opening stitch by stitch, hide the yarn inside.



Hind paw - lower part (make 2):

- 1. sc 6 in MR (6)
- 2. inc x6 (12)
- 3. (sc 1, inc) x6 (18)
- 4. (sc 2, inc) x6 (24)
- 5.-7. (3 Rounds) sc in each st (24)
- 8. (sc 6, dec) x3 (21)
- 9.-11. (3 Rounds) sc in each st (21)
- 12. (sc 5, dec) x3 (18)
- 13.-15. (3 Rounds) sc in each st (18)
- 16. (sc 4, dec) x3 (15)



17.-22. (6 Rounds) sc in each st (15)

23. (sc 1, dec) x5 (10)

Stuff and shape the paw.

Fasten off, leave a long tail for sewing. Sew paw and leg together (see pictures), don't cut the yarn if it's long enough to sew the whole leg to the body later.



Forefeet (2x):

1. sc 6 in MR (6)

2. inc x6 (12)

3. (sc 3, inc) x3 (15)

4.-12. (9 Rounds) sc in each st (15)

13. dec, sc 13 (14)

14. dec, sc 12 (13)

15. dec, 11fM (12)

16.-22. (7 Rounds) sc in each st (12)

Stuff paw, more loosely to the top.

23. dec x6 (6)

Fasten off, leave a long tail for sewing.

Tail:

1. sc 6 in MR (6)

2. inc x6 (12)

3. (sc 1, inc) x6 (18)

4. (sc 2, inc) x6 (24)

5. (sc 3, inc) x6 (30)

6.-10. (5 Rounds) sc in each st (30)

11. (sc 3, dec) x6 (24)

12. (sc 2, dec) x6 (18)

Fasten off, leave a long tail for sewing. Stuff the tail.

Ear (make 2):

1. sc 6 in MR (6)

2. inc x6 (12)

3. (sc 1, inc) x6 (18)

4. (sc 2, inc) x6 (24)

5. (sc 3, inc) x6 (30)

6.-15. (10 Rounds) sc in each st (30)

16. (sc 13, dec) x2 (28)

17. sc in each st (28)

18. (sc 12, dec) x2 (26)

19. sc in each st (26)
20. (sc 11, dec) x2 (24)
21. sc in each st (24)
22. (sc 10, dec) x2 (22)
23. sc in each st (22)
24. (sc 9, dec) x2 (20)
25. sc in each st (20)
26. (sc 8, dec) x2 (18)
27. sc in each st (18)
28. (sc 4, dec) x3 (15)
29. sc in each st (15)

Fasten off, leave a long tail for sewing.

Flatten the piece and sew together the upper edge.

If you like, the inside can be colored pink with crayon or something like that.

All pieces are ready and have to be attached now. Head and body are joined already, as well as the upper and lower part of the hind legs. Otherwise do it now.

First I've pinned all the pieces to it's right place and changed it if needed until everything looked nice. Change it as much as needed, it is worthwhile to be extra careful here (see pictures below).

Once you have found the right position for everything, sew all parts together.



If you still feel like it, you can crochet some accessories for your hare. The following hat looks like it's knitted. If you prefer to knit, feel free to do that. If you want to crochet the hat, follow the instructions. You have to watch this video for more informations (just click this link): [Longbeanie häkeln](#). I've adjusted the number of stitches to fit bunny's head. Maybe You have to adjust it to.

optional:

Hat:

Worsted weight yarn, suggested hook size 6 mm

Crochet in rows.

ch 28

1. (BLO: slst 27, ch 1, turn

2. BLO: slst 25, ch 1, turn



3. *BLO*: slst 21, ch 1, turn
4. *BLO*: slst 19, ch 1, turn
5. *BLO*: slst 19 + slst 4, ch 1, turn
6. *BLO*: slst 23 + slst 2 + slst 2KM, ch 1, turn]

Repeat row 1-6 as often as required until the head size is reached. Crochet both sides together with 27 slip stitches and close the hat as shown in the video.

optional:

Basket:

Parcel twine doubled, hook size 4 mm

Crochet in closed rounds, at the beginning of each round ch 1, close each round with a slip stitch in the first stitch.

Do an oval again.

1. ch 6, starting from second ch from hook: sc 4, sc 3 in last st, *rotate 180 degrees and continue on the opposite side of the chain*: sc 3, inc (12)
2. inc, sc 3, inc 3, sc 3, inc 2 (18)
3. sc, inc, sc 3, (sc, inc) x 3, sc 3, (sc, inc) x 2 (24)
4. *Insert hook from behind through both loops (alternative BLO)*: sc in each st (24)
- 5.- 6. sc in each st around (24)
7. rev sc 24 (24)

Fasten off, weave in loose ends.

For the handle make a chain in the desired length and go back crocheting single crochets or make a cord shown in: [this video](#) (< – click). Sew the handle to the basket.



optional:

Mini Easter egg:

Sport weight yarn (color of choice), hook size 2.0 mm

1. sc 5 in MR (5)
2. inc x5 (10)
3. sc in each st (10)
4. (sc 1, inc) x5 (15)
- 5.-7. (3 Rounds) sc 1, inc (15)
8. (sc 3, dec) x3 (12)

Stuff the egg.

9. dec x6 (6)

Fasten off invisibly.



optional:

Carrot:

Sport weight yarn (orange), hook size 2.0 mm

1. sc 6 in MR (6)
2. sc in each st (6)
3. (sc 2, inc) x2 (8)
4. sc in each st (8)
5. (sc 3, inc) x2 (10)
6. sc in each st (10)
7. (sc 4, inc) x2 (12)
8. sc in each st (12)
9. (sc 5, inc) x2 (14)



10. sc in each st (14)
11. (sc 6, inc) x2 (16)
12. sc in each st (16)
13. (sc 7, inc) x2 (18)
14. sc in each st (18)
15. (sc 8, inc) x2 (20)
- 16.-18. (3 Rounds) sc in each st (20)
19. (sc 2, dec) x5 (15)
20. (sc 1, dec) x5 (10)

Stuff and shape the carrot.

21. dec x5 (5)
 22. 5 loop stitches (or sc 5 and sew 5 loops in the middle)
- Fasten off invisibly.*
